Inside Out or Outside In?

Caution: movie spoilers ahead. Recently, we had friends visiting from Wisconsin and on a hot day, decided to see a movie. Our choice? Inside Out 2. I've been excited to see this movie, especially as the title character was turning 13. I went as a parent of a teen and a pastor who wants to see how Hollywood understands the proper balancing of life.

In this movie, the emotions inside 13-year-old Riley's head are met with upgrades in their control room and new emotions move in, including Anxiety, who begins to take over the console and run Riley's life, destroying Riley's belief system and starting from scratch. At the low point, Joy, the protagonist, doesn't know what to do. She thinks maybe the older you get, the less joy you have. Anxiety can't be stopped, she thinks. Without going into detail, it all works out in the end. Joy and Anxiety manage to work together, agreeing on the messiness of Riley's belief system that contains statements like "I'm a good person" but also "I'm not perfect" and that it's okay to have both.


While, we understand that those do better at working together than separately, they actually don't work well together at all. Instead of moving together, they move like feet as we walk, alternately. The left has to take a step followed by the right. The left can't take us anywhere, we'll fall, same with the right. So, they are never side by side, but always working alternately.

The movie implies the cure for imperfection is remembering I'm a good person. The cure for perceived faults is then remembering I'm not perfect. But those can't lead to true joy because outside of perfection, we're not good at all. Paul writes in Romans, "None is righteous, no not one." Jesus also says, "be perfect as my Father in heaven is perfect." That's a high bar. A high bar that our emotions will never be able to meet by simply trying to stabilize things.

There may be a sense of balance, but it will continue to run below the bar. The key to life is not finding balance in our emotions from the inside out but by receiving the love and righteousness of God in Christ from the outside in. It admits our imperfection that anxiety is trying to caution us about, but then it fuels our joy in that we don't have to work toward perfection because we have the perfection of Jesus, given to us by his death on the cross and resurrection from the dead. More can be said on this, but it would take up too much space.

I wonder if a future Inside Out movie would include something like faith to steer the ship. I'm not holding my breath. But, see the movie, it is a good one with many insights. Laugh along the way, see some of these signs, and then think about how important a role faith plays in this crazy existence we call life.

Faith is a Gift!

I have been recently reflecting on what is faith and many Bible verses come to mind. One definitely is Hebrews 11:6, "And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him."

This clears up some confusion over the nature of faith. You and I often get confused about the nature of faith. We are tempted to believe that we must earn God's good gifts. But a gift can't be earned...right? What makes it an actual gift is that it is completely free. We don't pay for gifts or earn gifts. But maybe our perception of a gift is skewed. After all, we learned, "You better watch out, you better not cry, you better not pout, I'm telling you why..." For many, even gift giving has conditions attached, "If you aren't good, you'll get a lump of coal in your stocking." My point is, God's gifts have zero conditions attached!

Faith is a gift too! We don't produce faith. We just can't do it! You are in a right relationship with God because God has given you the gift of faith. Your trust in the Savior's gift of forgiveness did not come from you; it came from outside of you. You are trusting in Jesus because God has granted you the gift of faith!

Without faith, it is impossible to please God. Listen to this: you are pleasing in God's sight, because God through Christ has birthed within your hearts by the power of His Word.

This brings us to another aspect of faith. Faith is a gift given by God, through the power of His Word (the Bible). St. Paul writes in Romans 10:17, "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ." Apart from the Word of God faith cannot be birthed in the ears of unbelievers. It is only by hearing (or reading) the message of the Bible that God grants the gift of faith to unbelievers. Therefore, St. Paul also says in the same passage, "How can they believe in the One of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone **preaching** to them?"

Are there practical implications here? Yes! Hearing the message preached by the pastor is necessary to the creation and maintenance of saving faith. Preaching is also a gift given to you.

Do you doubt God's goodness directed towards you? We all do from time to time. Then it is doubly imperative that you hear the preaching of God's Word. Without hearing, you may not believe that God is for you and not against you. The good news that is preached is the good news that causes you to believe and trust that you are forgiven by the merits of Christ alone.

Come to church and hear God's Word!



Zion Reaches Out to Finleyville Residents Who Sustained Tornado Damage.



The BMF Committee donated \$2,000 worth of Aldi gift cards to the residents of Finleyville who sustained significant damage as a result of the EF2 tornado on May 11. Pictured in the photo are Jacob Lawrence, Finleyville VFC Fire Chief, John Thatcher, BMF chairperson, and Kevin Harris, Police Chief of Mon City (consolidated police department for New Eagle, Union Township and Finleyville Borough). According to these first responders, Zion Lutheran was the first church to reach out into the community to offer support. The overall damage didn't meet the minimum requirement for federal disaster aid, and yet the community needed help.

As a follow up, Pastor Magera reached out to a resident that he knew had property damage, only to find out they had already received 2 gift cards from Zion. Our outreach program is clearly working to get these gifts into the hands of people that need it.
