A Message from Pastor Mathew

As we navigate our busy lives, it's easy to forget significant spiritual milestones. One such milestone is our baptism—a sacred event where we were welcomed into God's family, cleansed of sin, and marked with the cross of Christ forever. In the Lutheran tradition, we believe that celebrating baptism anniversaries is a meaningful way to remember and reaffirm our identity in Christ.

Baptism is more than a ritual; it's a divine promise of God's unending grace and love. By celebrating our baptism anniversaries, we take time to reflect on the profound significance of this sacrament. It's an opportunity to remember that, through baptism, we are reborn into a life of faith, hope, and love.

For families, celebrating a baptism anniversary can be a beautiful tradition. Lighting a baptism candle, sharing the story of someone's baptism day, or looking at pictures and memorabilia can help children and adults alike connect with their faith journey. It's a tangible way to teach younger generations about the importance of baptism and to celebrate God's continued work in our lives.

As a congregation, we can support each other in this practice. Did you know that we place baptism anniversaries in this newsletter each month? We even send cards to those newly baptized to help them remember that special day. For those that don't know their baptism date, we celebrate with them during the month in which Pentecost falls because Pentecost was the birthday of the Christian Church, a day when many were baptized.

To be very honest, I have trouble celebrating my own baptism anniversary. I know my baptism month (February) but I can't always remember the day. It's much easier for me to remember things like my birthday, my anniversary, and Star Wars Day. Okay, the last one isn't really that important. But, those days we remember easily are usually surrounded by celebration, dinner out, greeting cards, or presents. Perhaps, to place more importance on our baptism anniversaries, we should begin to treat them like other significant dates and do something to celebrate. We light candles for birthday cakes and sing "Happy Birthday" so why can't we bake a cake, light our baptism candle, and sing "Amazing Grace"? Give it a try next time your baptism anniversary comes around and see how that opportunity to rejoice in the gift of baptism helps to renew your faith and to look with a transformed perspective on the incredible journey God has set before you.

Summer is here, and we have been experiencing higher than normal temperatures. As I am sure you noticed, there have been times when Zion's air conditioning has not been working at its best.

The Ministry of Property has informed the Council that the air conditioning system will continue to break down often. The entire system needs to be replaced at an estimated cost of \$100,000. Right now, donations for this project are just over \$11,000. To keep you informed, we're tracking these donations on a "thermometer" in the narthex and we still have a long way to go.

Asking for donations and talking about money is not something that the Council likes to do. However, we know how preferable a cool and comfortable church building will be as we gather for worship services and fellowship events.

The COE is asking that each of you, as able, consider giving a little each month to the air conditioning fund, in addition to your regular offering. Your regular offering will continue to fund the church's ministries and routine expenses. We thank each of you for prayerfully considering this request to assure future summer services will be comfortable and cool. And that as Zion celebrates its 225th anniversary in August 2025, we will be able to celebrate in the cool air of a working air conditioner.

The Ministry of Disciple Life Invites You to Take the Next Step Vicky Thatcher, Chair

In last month's newsletter, the Ministry of Disciple Life asked if anyone was willing to take the next step to serve alongside Karen Stoddart on the weekly Lenten meals, the Saturday summer cookouts, and Zion's Angel Tree event. Thank you to Joyce Cole for being willing to serve on the Angel Tree event! Servants are still needed for Zion's fellowship events.

+ Serving with Karen Stoddart to oversee one of our fellowship events (weekly Lenten meals or the 2 Saturday summer cookouts) would involve communicating the events with the congregation through the office, determining food needs for the event, and organizing the set up/cleanup. Our fellowship events include weekly Lenten meals and 2 Saturday summer cookouts (one in June and one in July).

As communicated last month, the Ministry of Disciple Life is responsible for organizing and overseeing the majority of the in-reach and outreach events here at Zion. Currently, we have one person leading each event, but Jesus sent His disciples out "two by two" – to share the burden, as well as to support and encourage each other. We would like to follow Jesus' example by having someone (maybe you) take the next step and join one of Zion's events as a co-leader. You do not need to become a member of the Ministry of Disciple Life. This month, our focus is on the events currently led by Lane Magera. Please prayerfully consider serving with your sister in Christ, Lane, in one of the following areas:

- Serve with Lane in overseeing the Community Clothes Exchange (CCE) held at Zion four (4) times per year. This would involve communicating the event with the congregation through the office, coordinating the dates with the office and Mattie from the CCE, collecting/ordering new underwear and socks for the event, coordinating Zion members to serve at the event, and coordinating set-up and clean-up with Harold.
- + Serve with Lane in overseeing the NALC Disaster Response Packing Event which is held 1 or 2 times per year, depending on available funding. This would involve communicating the event with the congregation through the office, selecting the type of packing event to be held, ordering the materials needed for the event, and coordinating the set-up and clean-up with Harold.

It is my hope and prayer that the Holy Spirit will move some of you to consider taking a next step in one of these areas!
